

When asked if the Port will be able to maintain the level of rehabilitation seen at the Ferry Building, one local developer replied:

"It is not possible to continue such development. There are the physical costs of development. There are the influences of regulatory agencies with different roles and jurisdictional responsibilities ...and market realities making it economically challenging and important to be able to reach compromises, build new alliances, and to balance otherwise competing goals."
