


BUT CALIFORNIA FACES SERIOUS PROBLEMS

- Gridlock in state government




Since the 1990s, CA's unemployment rate has consistently been higher than the U.S.


BUT CALIFORNIANS EXPECT MORE

- Mistrust in leaders is the road block to reform.



WHAT DO WE NEED GOVERNMENT TO HELP US ACHIEVE?


Our policies should always lead to:

HOW DO WE GET THERE?


- Focus on Outcomes
- Align Authority with Responsibility
- Focus State Role
- Encourage Regional Collaboration
- Examine Efficiency of Public Functions





FOCUS ON OUTCOMES

- Taxpayers must be able to determine whether public programs are achieving their goals.
- Public programs should work collaboratively, with a focus on outcomes.
- Programs should be measured regularly.
- Outcomes should be tied to indicators like employment rates, graduation rates, obesity rates, and crime rates.





ALIGN AUTHORITY WITH RESPONSIBILITY


- Local governments should have the authority to do what is best for their community.
- State sets standards and guidelines
- Ensure each government program is transparent so people can hold the appropriate body accountable for results.



FOCUS STATE ROLE


The state should:

- Establish performance goals for local govt
- Tie goals to performance-based budgeting
- Assist local govts so they can meet goals
- Intervene when local government can't or won't meet goals
- Reconsider the role of state agencies



ENCOURAGE REGIONAL COLLABORATION

- Local government agencies should work together
- Makes delivery of many services more efficient
- Allows local governments to mobilize their combined resources to meet big challenges
- The State should give incentives for regional governments to work together





EXAMINE EFFICIENCY OF PUBLIC FUNCTIONS

- Review and improve local services
- Reduce barriers to reorganization
- Make cost and performance comparisons public
- LAFCOs should have more authority to ensure local government efficiency
