










What's Happening: Physical Access

What's Happening: Cultural Access Community/HOPE role

- Visit store regularly to see how project is going and if owner needs support
- Participate in quarterly evaluation of store
- Conduct customer surveys
- Provide regular feedback to HOPE regarding the project

What are the Lessons Learned?

- Working with retailers takes time need to build trust, and retailers need to have "skin in the game"
- Collaborative effort is needed Government agencies (public health, planning, and economic development agencies), Advocates, Business, CBO's/Safety Net agencies
- The best initiatives are community driven

Reflections on Recommendations

- Strategies good balance of increasing physical access and increasing demand
- Important to understand cannot solve the issue of food insecurity by food alone- need to increase economics = purchasing power
- Urban Ag can also be included in Strategy 3 making food available, and not just and education tool

What Would I do with \$10 Million

OFPC Members Recommends:

- Land acquisition and the building of market farms
- Provide grants for food related projects with deliverables related to job creation and market sustainability
- Direct lobbying and Grass roots organizing
- Build a food hub
- Build infrastructure for food recovery and redistribution hub

What Would I do with \$10 Million

- Infrastructure to invest in locally run good food businesses – training, tech assistance, loan/investing fund, etc.
- Fruit and Vegy incentive program for both retailers and consumers
- Minimum wage increase and income tax reform
