





# 3. Subways are awesome, but not right for everywhere



### Grade separation is awesome







Capacity = 63 passengers/vehicle

Capacity = 119/vehicle

Upgrade to articulated bus → 50% increase to 94

Put 4 together into one consist → 400% increase to 476 passengers/trainset


