Impact Highlight: We led the creation of the immigrant food program

— 40,000 people annually— \$64 million in food a year

food4all means food regardless of immigration status



Impact Highlight: We led the way in paperlessly enrolling students in free meals

- Over 650,000 more students a year



food4all means people only have to tell their story once to get help



Impact Highlight: We led effort to end fingerprinting for food

- over 170,000 people a year to receive meals
- over \$280 million in food a year




food4all means people get food with dignity and without hassles

Impact Highlight: CFPA leads the way on Breakfast After the Bell

Over 350,000 more students got BAB —improving student outcomes, cognitive function, academic achievement, behavioral and emotional health, diet and physical health, and school attendance food4all means kids start their day fed and ready to learn



Impact Highlight: We helped hungry households with reliable transportation

- Over 400,000 people a a year
- Over \$700 million in food a year

food4all means not having to choose between help with food and a car to get to work



Impact Highlight: We led CalFresh rebranding to reduce stigma and connect to agriculture

- Over 4,000,000 people participate in CalFresh
- Over \$700 billion in food a year from CalFresh
