


If Oakland is booming why is budget gap worse?




BUDGET GAP

Costs are growing far faster than revenues




Urgent Needs and Required Voter Mandates


Expenditures by Department (All Funds)

Bad News: Field and park conditions will suffer



Good News: Budget increases priority services using new and increased revenue



FY 19-21 Started with Closing a \$93 million Gap

- Shifted costs to restricted sources wherever possible
- Added only project-funded and cost-recovering positions
- Froze 8.5 FTE Parks Maintenance jobs

New & Increased Fees

 Rent Adjustment Program (RAP), wage enforcement, affordable housing impact, fire inspections, Measure KK for roads and housing, Measure D for libraries, Measure W for homelessness and illegal dumping, Measure HH for health initiatives...






