- 174,000 Daily Riders (peaked at 189,000 in Feb 2020)
- 635 Revenue Vehicles
- 153 Bus Routes
- 65% Low-income Riders
- 73% Minority Riders
- \$65.7 mil Annual Fare Revenue
- 16.7% Farebox Recovery

- Local Fare \$2.50
- Transbay Fare \$6.00
- Local Day Pass \$5.50
- Y/S/D Discount
- Clipper Discount
- Monthly Passes

COVID-19 Response

- 35% Service Reduction
 - Sunday Plus Service Levels
- Social Distancing Vehicle Capacity
 Limits 10 Pax/40ft Bus
- Daily Vehicle Sanitizing
- Free Fares to allow for Rear-door Boarding
- 72% Ridership Decrease
- \$5 mil Monthly Fare Revenue Loss
- Anticipated Significant Sales Tax
 Revenue Loss





Restoration of Fare Collection

- FTA and Board policies allow for sixmonths of free fare as a pilot program
- Installation of operator protective shields this summer
- Recoup a fraction of farebox revenue
- Demand exceeds vehicle capacity
