
Our Goal

Administrative Pathway to Covering Medically-Supportive Food & Nutrition

CalAIM: California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal

In Lieu of Services (ILOS): Flexible wrap-around services provided as a substitute, or to avoid, other Medi-Cal covered services such as ER utilization, a hospital or skilled nursing facility admission, or a discharge delay.



Precedent

MassHealth Flexible Services: Directed to pilot evidence-based approaches that address a member's health-related social needs with the goal of improving health outcomes and reducing the total cost of health care for the member

Alameda Alliance's Role in the Health Care System

- Established by the Alameda County Board of Supervisors in 1996 to serve residents in Alameda County's safety net
- Core functions include administering access to health services and supporting members with transitions of care services
- Administers payment for inpatient, outpatient, pharmacy, transportation, translation, durable medical equipment, and other supportive services
- □ 282,000 people are enrolled with the Alliance (82%)
 - □ 276,000 members enrolled in Medi-Cal
 - 6,000 members enrolled in "GroupCare" Alameda County In-Home Supports & Services (IHSS) workers
- 7,000+ providers in our network, including hospitals, primary care physicians, specialists, pharmacies, and other service organizations 2



Medi-Cal & Medically-Supportive Food and Nutrition

- In 2017, started to invest in pilot programs to expand operations into social determinants of health, investments continuing each year
- Self-funded the Health Home Program and transitioned to the state program in 2019, building primary care network to implement community-based models of care
- AC3 / Whole Person Care: Alliance administers the case management service bundle for Alameda County
- ALL IN / Food As Medicine partnership started in 2019, linking primary care to address food insecurities
- CalAIM begins on January 1, 2022; community listening sessions for enhanced care management & in-lieu of services started in April



Medically Tailored Meals Program – "Flex Services"

- Community Servings delivers five days' worth of medically tailored meals (MTM) in one weekly meal delivery for a duration of six months
- Weekly meal delivery includes 5 lunches (combination of soups, stews, salads), 5 dinner entrees, milk, fruit, desserts and snacks.
- Our medically tailored meals provide roughly 2/3 of a client's daily caloric needs based on a 2,000 calorie per day diet.
- We offer five core diets (Cardiac, Diabetic, Pediatric, Renal, Wellness) and additional customization and tailoring to create 15 medial diets
- Client receives one in-depth nutritional intake upon referral and up to three additional nutrition counseling sessions during duration of service





Four additional Medicaid ACOs have submitted applications to the state for Flex programs to start Summer 2021.

Community Servings has **seven** other healthcare contracts (Medicare Advantage, Dual Eligible, Home Hospital, Private/Commercial Insurer)



- Referral is sent electronically either via Community Servings Referral Portal (HIPAA * secure extension of internal Salesforce Database) OR referral transaction platform (Aunt Birthday, SMC Partners

ACO PARTNERSHIPS

- 1. Community Care Cooperative launched April 2020
- 2. Boston Children's Hospital ACO launched Jan 2021
- **3.** Boston Medical Center Health Net launched April 2021

REFERRAL PROCESS

- ACO screens patients for food insecurity & health needs
- •Referrals are sent via shared platform *or* secure email
 - Include details about patient demographics and health conditions
- •Dependent on ACO services are pre-approved or need to be individually approved

SERVICES OFFERED

- Initial intake assessment
 - •Supermarket gift cards
 - Transportation assistance
 - •Kitchen supplies
 - •Cooking classes
 - Nutrition coaching
 - •Referrals

•Follow up calls at 3, 6 & 9 months
