Current Activities of Andrea Baker Consulting

- Supporting Local Businesses: Bayview Bistro Boxes
 - Created and facilitated packaged meals from local Bayview Bistro vendors in a "Weekly Meal Box"
 - Activated a space in the Bayview for picking up the Boxes (Southeast Community Facility)
 - Supported six local Bayview businesses through the production of these boxes, catering opportunities and providing meals to food insecure communities (SF New Deal)

Current Activities of Andrea Baker Consulting

- Advocating for Underrepresented Neighborhoods: Fillmore Merchant and Neighborhood Collaborative
 - Worked with Fillmore merchants and neighborhood to understand needs, concerns, and advocate for resources and programs
 - Facilitated meetings that educate the community on voter registration, census count,
 ballot measures, and programs provided by the City
 - Coordinating with the Fillmore Merchant and Neighborhood Collaborative a "First Fridays Marketplace" on Fillmore (incorporating both brick and mortar and pop up businesses)

Challenges Businesses are Facing with Reopenings

Challenges with Outdoor Dining

- Wind tunnels in the evening
- Trash, unclean streets during operating hours
- Challenges securing permits for the parklets with Shared Spaces
- Sidewalk width not enough to maintain social distance from pedestrians and customers in some areas

Challenges with Reopening

- o Rents, utilities still need to get paid
- Difficult to gauge the cost/benefit analysis for being open at 25% capacity versus being open for pick-ups only (staffing difficulties)
- Difficulties ensuring safety protocols for both customers and staff for reopening of indoor dining

Recovery Programs Offered by City

Just Released Recovery Programs:

- SF Shines for Reopening
 - Grants for reopening activities
 - Amounts are between \$2,000 \$5,000
 - Specifically targeted for interior and outdoor fixtures related to health and safety such as air filters, furniture, acrylic shields etc.
 - No repayment required
 - Applications are open at: https://sf.gov/sf-shines

Recovery Programs Offered by City

- SF Hardship Emergency Loan Program (SF HELP)
 - Provided loans of up to \$50,000 at 0% to low-income businesses in low income neighborhoods
 - Based around hardship and recovery
 - Phase III Coming Soon
- African American Small Business Revolving Loan Fund
 - Specifically targets African American Businesses located in San Francisco
 - Had received \$1M in funding
 - Anticipating receiving additional funds to continue providing businesses with funding
