THE BAY AREA NOW

Most of the Bay Area's biggest challenges are both regional and interrelated. But its government institutions are not organized to deliver solutions at scale or to address interconnected issues. The region's atomized structure of governance includes more than 100 cities, nine counties and roughly 3,400 special districts. When these institutions fail to sufficiently address the toughest challenges in the region — including the housing crisis, traffic congestion and climate change — they effectively pass off the burden to neighboring communities that are equally unsuited to solve these issues.

SPUR envisions the Bay Area as a region in which all people thrive.

To solve the most pressing challenges and prepare for the future, the Bay Area needs to act regionally. In the future Bay Area, governments are structured, resourced and empowered to most effectively serve and provide for the collective good.
