


Addressing today's most pressing challenges requires developing the capacity to lead collaboratively and to effectively work across sectors.



Why is a cross-sector approach needed for climate change?




2024 sets a record as the warmest year in modern times







Emission reduction goals

CAP sets TARGETS

CAP sets GOALS

Supply 100% GHG-free electricity at affordable rates

CAP sets DIRECTION



By 2040, transition the district system steam loop serving downtown and Civic Center to renewable and/or GHG-free energy.






AND . . .

Sets a strong market signal






Lenses of climate action


