# San Francisco

### Implementation:

Joint city/county passed the law on August 7, 2014. People can now apply to put parcels under contract.

### Status:

One parcel under contract: 18th and Rhode Island Garden, 0.11 acres.

# County of Sacramento

### Implementation:

# City of San Jose

#### Implementation:

City passed ordinance and began accepting application at end of 2016.

# City of San Diego

### Implementation:

City passed an ordinance on January 20, 2016, but City hasn't finalized applications yet. They are currently working with the County on fiscal impact analysis. The San Diego Food System Alliance expects the program to start some time in February 2017.

Two property owners (one community garden and one that has vacant land) have shown interest and would qualify for the program, once adopted by the city.

# City of Los Angeles

### Implementation:

LA County passed and adopted the program in April 2016. City Planning Commission had hearing about city ordinance in Oct 2016. More legislative movement from City Council expected in early 2017.

# County of Los Angeles

#### Implementation:

The program was approved by the County BoS on April 12, 2016, with city mayors receiving notification three days later. The county started accepting UAIZ applications for unincorporated properties beginning May 12, 2016.

No one has entered into the program in the unincorporated areas, though according to the LA Food Policy Council, there is interest shown on the county level.
